Stuart A. Newman, Ph.D., professor of cell biology and anatomy, received \$1,055,837, part of a new three-year \$14.5 million international program, "Agency, Directionality, and Function: Foundations for a Science of Purpose," funded by the John Templeton Foundation. Dr. Newman will serve as the principal investigator of a multisite project on "Cellular Agency in Multicellular Development and Cancer" that includes experimental and theoretical scientists and philosophers of biology. The John Templeton Foundation serves as a philanthropic catalyst for discoveries relating to deep and perplexing questions facing humankind and supports research on subjects ranging from complexity, evolution and emergence to creativity, forgiveness and free will.
