The 2014 Chancellor's Research Award, formerly the Dean's Research Award, was presented to **Wilbert S. Aronow, M.D.**, right, professor of medicine, on January 28. The award was presented in recognition of his identification of the adverse effects of exposure to heavy air pollution from freeway traffic on angina pectoris and being first to

describe silent myocardial ischemia. Dr. Aronow is a leader in the area of geriatric cardiology and has authored or co-authored more than 1,300 papers, 980 abstracts, edited 12 books and has authored national guidelines for blood pressure treatment in the elderly. **D. Douglas Miller, M.D., C.M., M.B.A.**, dean of the School of Medicine, was on hand to present the award in the absence of Edward C. Halperin, M.D., M.A., chancellor and chief executive officer. After the award presentation, Dr. Aronow gave the research award lecture, "2015 Update on Treatment of Hypertension."

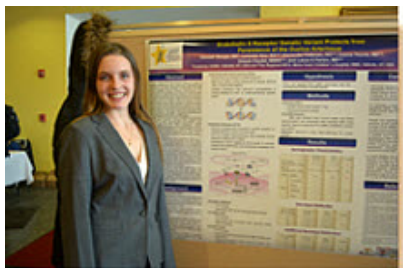
Historical Faculty Portraits Adorn the Walls of MEC Lobby



Six large scale late 19th century oil paintings of NYMC's early faculty have been installed in the lobby of the Medical Education Center (MEC). These portraits depict some of the key figures who played leading roles in the formative years of the College (then known as the

New York Homeopathic Medical College). Reflecting the College's second home at New York Ophthalmic Hospital (1872-1889), several of these portraits depict members of the ophthalmology faculty.
