



Elie Wiesel Nobel Peace Prize Acceptance Speech December 10, 1986 — Oslo, Norway

Through humility Elie Wiesel packs an effective punch. This soft spoken person has not only become a spokesman for Jewry, but for the world at large. The cloak of the Nobel Peace Prize has not changed the person, but is the key which will open many doors as he continues to dedicate his life's work to helping human rights, freeing Soviet Refuseniks, as well as continuing to teach the younger generations the lessons of the Holocaust.


When asked if the Holocaust could happen again he replied, "I don't think so, not the way it happened (pause). Lest we forget, forgetting would be a greater tragedy." As for those who deny the actual existance "they are not worthy of our mention". It is of great importance to better educate the world with emphasis to the young and generations to come about remembering.

Although Mr. Wiesel's plea to President Reagan not to go to Bitburg went unheeded, the overwhelming effect was to turn the attention of millions to aspects of the Holocaust.

Many questions were asked, including one concerning Israel's fate surrounded by a sea of hatred . His reply was "these are questions I have asked and would also like to know the answers to."

In conclusion the message he leaves to students is:

"The burdens are many, it is up to the students to transform them . . . Hopefully into something good".

#### Dear Graduates:


It is with a great deal of pleasure and pride that I congratulate you on your graduation from Touro College.


Elie Wiesel spoke with fervent forthrightness and calm courage to the President of the United States so that all the world could hear that the visit to Bitburg to lay a wreath on the gravestones of German soldiers as Nazi victims could not be compared to the unprovoked and vicious slaughter of innocent, talented, and loving men, women and children.

As recipient of the Nobel Prize, Elie Wiesel addressed the civilized world on the necessity of not absolving ourselves of guilt by mere recognition and awards, by monuments and memorial meetings.

In appearing before the leadership of the Soviet Union, Elie Wiesel urgently demanded freedom of emigration from Russia, thus supporting the Refuseniks and giving them genuine hope for freedom.
