During this COVID-19 pandemic and other future events, the CDM will continue to be a source of reliable information, education and models for mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery.

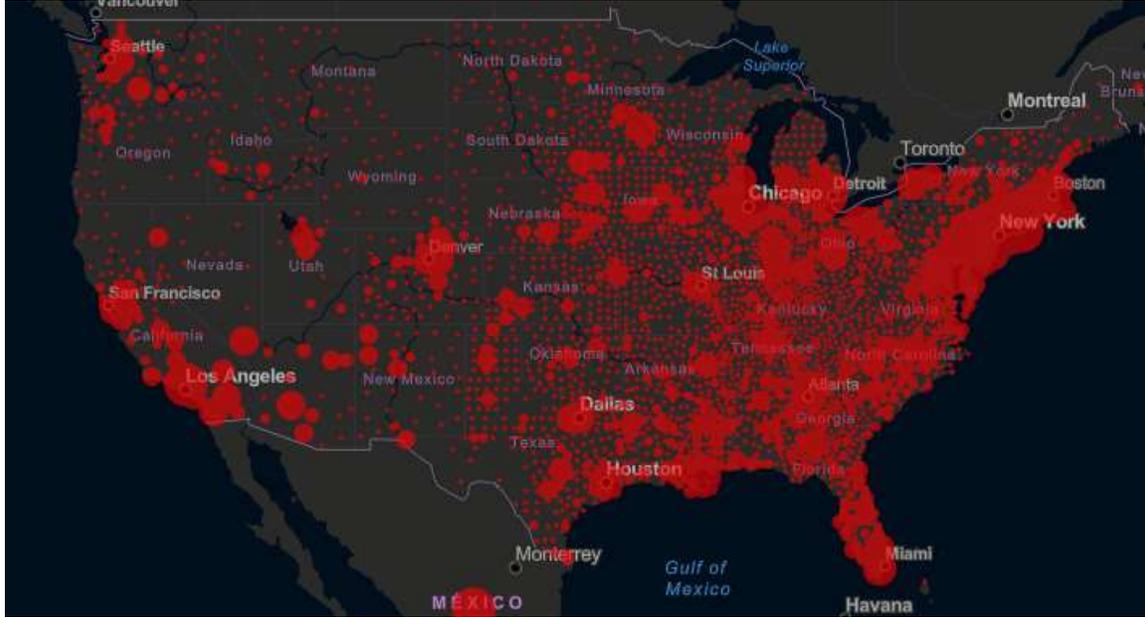

Center for Disaster Medicine Updates

- Coordinating volunteers to support local public health response to COVID-19.
- Conducting research and analysis of current events and COVID-19 response to identify strengths and areas for improvement in other regions.
- Updating and developing new programs to provide enhanced education on public health emergencies including pandemics.
- Redesigning summer fellowship in disaster and emergency medicine to better address preparedness skills, lessons learned and highlight the importance of high-fidelity simulation in medical education while finding new focus on pandemic-related research projects.
- Exploring course development opportunities in infection prevention and control for frontline responders in the hospital and in the field.
- Serving as a source of information for COVID-19 related concerns or questions regarding public health, emergency medical service (EMS), public safety and healthcare response.
- Local networking and pandemic response analysis for New York's tri-state area, using first-person experiences to highlight current trends.

Federal Updates

- Reports of violence associated with social distancing guidelines have been on the rise in the United States, and elsewhere, concerning both law enforcement and the public. <https://apnews.com/012f3c6a3706316776e2d7128531e68e>
- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recently added a Framework for Non-COVID-19 Care to its guidance library to provide health care systems with a high-

level plan for delivering non-COVID-19 health care during the COVID-19 pandemic. <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/hcp/framework-non-COVID-care.html>

- The CDC also updated the Interim Laboratory Biosafety Guidelines for handling and processing specimens associated with COVID-19 to provide additional information about point-of-care (POC) testing for SARS-CoV-2. The update includes guidance on the use of instruments at a location associated with a current Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 certificate, site- and activity-specific risk assessments, proper training for staff, precautions when handling clinical specimens, and decontamination of POC instruments. <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-nCoV/lab/lab-biosafety-guidelines.html>
- The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Science and Technology Directorate (S&T) released a predictive modeling tool to estimate natural decay of SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19) under a range of temperatures and relative humidity. Leveraging the results of research being conducted at S&T's National Biodefense Analysis and Countermeasures Center (NBACC), the tool is designed to assist response efforts and estimate the environmental persistence of the virus under certain combinations of temperatures and humidity. <https://www.dhs.gov/science-and-technology/sars-calculator>
- The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced the launch of the COVID Coach app, a new mobile app designed to help both Veterans and civilians cope with feelings of stress and anxiety they may be experiencing during the COVID-19 pandemic. <https://www.va.gov/opa/pressrel/pressrelease.cfm?id=5448>
- The VA announced it has maintained an increasing supply of beds for both Veterans and COVID-19 patients, steady supplies across the nation and a stable staffing situation in the vast majority of VA locations nearly two months into the national emergency. As of late April, VA had the capacity to take in 12,215 critical and non-critical patients, up from 9,840 in March. <https://www.va.gov/opa/pressrel/pressrelease.cfm?id=5449>

- The President's 30 Days to Slow the Spread ended on April 30. President Trump has unveiled Guidelines for Opening Up America Again, a three-phased approach based on the advice of public health experts. These steps will help state and local officials when reopening their economies, getting people back to work, and continuing to protect American lives. State Updates

New York

- Governor Andrew M. Cuomo is directing hospitals statewide to prioritize COVID-19 testing for children displaying symptoms of multi-system inflammatory syndrome. <https://www.governor.ny.gov/news/governor-cuomo-announces-state-department-health-investigating-evidence-covid-19-can-cause>
- Central New York and the North Country Regions are ready to begin reopening on Friday, May 15. Along with the Finger Lakes, Southern Tier and Mohawk Valley, these regions have met all seven metrics required to begin phase one of the state's regional phased reopening plan. Phase one includes reopening construction, manufacturing, retail for curbside and in-store pickup, agriculture, forestry and fishing. <https://www.governor.ny.gov/news/amid-ongoing-covid-19-pandemic-governor-cuomo-announces-fourth-region-hits-benchmark-begin>
- Twelve more counties are now eligible to resume elective surgeries. The state will allow elective outpatient treatments to resume in counties and hospitals without significant risk of COVID-19 surge in the near term, and a total of 47 counties can now resume elective surgeries. This also includes Ambulatory Surgical Centers, which will continue to provide select diagnostic and screening procedures. 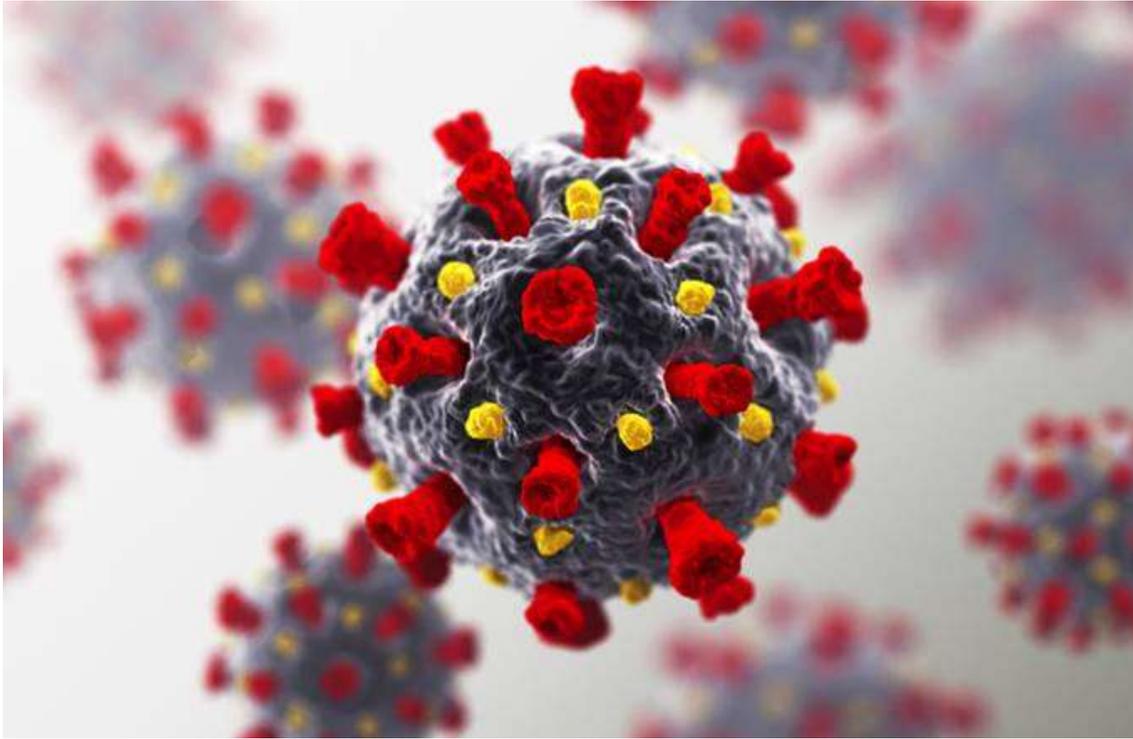
New Jersey

- To limit exposure and reduce the spread of COVID-19, Health Commissioner Judith Persichilli signed an Executive Directive requiring all long-term care facilities in the State to implement testing of staff and residents for the virus by May 26. In addition, the Executive Directive provides for retesting of individuals who test negative within three to seven days to detect those with newly developed infection, and further retesting in accordance with CDC guidance. https://www.state.nj.us/health/legal/covid19/05-12-2020_LTC_COVID19testing.pdf
- As part of New Jersey's Road Back, Governor Phil Murphy signed Executive Order No. 142, permitting the resumption of non-essential construction, curbside pickup at non-essential retail businesses, and car gatherings for the purpose of drive-through and drive-in events. The construction and non-essential retail provisions will take effect at 6:00 a.m. on Monday, May 18, while the car gatherings provision will take effect immediately. <https://nj.gov/infobank/eo/056murphy/pdf/EO-142.pdf>
- Governor Murphy signed Executive Order No. 143, allowing beaches, boardwalks, lakes, and lakeshores to remain open with social distancing measures in place. The directive takes effect on Friday, May 22. Under Governor Murphy's Executive Order, the following shall remain closed on private and public beaches, boardwalks, lakes, and lakeshores: water fountains, picnic areas, playgrounds, pavilions, indoor recreational facilities, and other buildings and facilities, such as visitor centers. There is an exception allowing bathrooms, showering areas, and changing areas to stay open. <https://nj.gov/infobank/eo/056murphy/pdf/EO-143.pdf>

Connecticut

- Governor Ned Lamont enacted Executive Order No. 7MM, which includes the following provisions:
 - Allows municipalities to expedite changes to their zoning rules or other ordinances to expand outdoor dining.

- Creates an expedited approval process for restaurants and other establishments that serve food to get fast-tracked permission to create or expand outdoor dining areas.
- Allows other businesses such as retail stores to get fast-tracked permission to sell goods on the sidewalk or in other outdoor areas, including shared spaces or spaces provided by municipalities.
- Allows restaurants and other businesses who already have liquor permits to serve alcohol only with food without applying for a separate patio or extension of use permit.
- Allows private clubs to sell alcohol only to their members for delivery or pickup.

- Governor Lamont enacted Executive Order No. 7NN, which includes the following provisions:
 - Waiver of statutory vote on supplemental federal block grant.
 - Remote participation in member meetings.
 - Waiver of certain regulatory limitations on the amount of support that can be provided to caregiver relatives.
 - Technical modification of grace period for April and May rent.
 - Authorization for OPM to direct DSS to provide Coronavirus Relief Fund distributions to nursing home facilities.
 - Authorization for OPM to direct DSS to provide Coronavirus Relief Fund distributions to COVID recovery facilities and alternate COVID recovery facilities.
 - Authorization for additional COVID-19 related hardship relief funding under the Coronavirus Relief Fund to nursing home facilities.
 - Coronavirus Relief Fund distribution determinations not subject to rehearing or appeal.
 - Extension and sunset of suspension of tax on single-use plastic checkout bags.

- The Connecticut Office of Early Childhood announced that it has launched “CTCARES for Family Child Care” to provide support to licensed family child-care providers during the COVID-19 public health emergency and beyond. The initiative is made possible with approximately \$830,000 in support from nonprofit organizations, including the Connecticut Early Childhood Funder Collaborative, 4-CT, and other philanthropic groups – and financial support continues to grow. <https://www.ctoec.org/covid-19/ctcares-for-family-child-care>
- Governor Lamont announced that the State of Connecticut is receiving \$111 million in federal coronavirus relief aid for the state’s school districts that will be used to support continued learning and address educational disruptions due to the global pandemic. <https://portal.ct.gov/Office-of-the-Governor/News/Press-Releases>
