of March 22, 2022**



The 18th COVID-19 Symposium in the series sponsored by NYMC and Touro University (TU) will take place on Tuesday, March 22, from noon to 1:30 p.m. The webinar will cover the latest on COVID-19 found in animals and what it means for virus mutations in humans; the administration of a fourth dose of vaccine; headaches as a symptom and as a long-term effect of prior infection; vaccination of children under five years of age; pandemics as the impetus for anti-Semitism; the rise in opiate-related

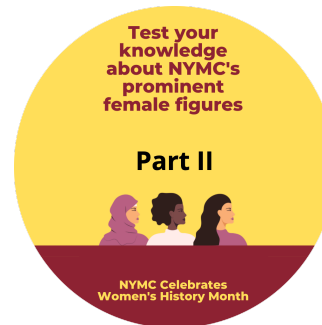
