Sangmi Chung, Ph.D., Receives Bridge Funding Grant

Sangmi Chung, Ph.D., associate professor of cell biology and anatomy, is the recipient of the Touro University Fall 2021 Bridge Funding Grant for her work, "Common Schizophrenia Variants Functioning in Developmental Human Cortical Interneurons." Recent large-scale genetic studies



of schizophrenia revealed that many human genome regions are strongly associated with schizophrenia risk, however it is not clear how these regions affect the risk of the disease. Dr. Chung will study how they affect specific nerve cells called interneurons. "Interneurons are highly affected by schizophrenia, so by studying these nerve cells, we can see how they increase the risk of schizophrenia. We will do this by using various genomics approaches that allow us to analyze how specific regions in the genome control the generation of specific proteins," explained Dr. Chung. "We are grateful for this opportunity to continue to address these important research questions."



organizations that improve lives and strengthen communities.




Meeting in New Orleans, on April 8 - 13. Despite their flight being canceled, they drove 1,300-plus miles to present their posters.



Michelle Carnazza, Ph.D. candidate in microbiology and immunology, presented "Role of COL26A1 in papillary thyroid cancer invasion."




