
Chioma M. Okeoma, Ph.D., Has Risen Above Adversity to Excel in Her Field

Rahim Hirani, SOM Class of 2025, has worked with his mentor, Abbas Smiley, M.D., Ph.D., research assistant professor of surgery, to publish several works over the course of the summer. One study, published in Surgery.

Technology International, "The risk of mortality in geriatric patients with emergent gastroparesis is 7-fold greater than that in adult patients: an analysis of 27,000 patients," analyzed gastroparesis, a chronic disorder where patients have



delayed gastric emptying and how mortality rates increased by each day that an elderly person did not receive treatment. Mr. Hirani also assisted with "Burden of antibiotics in patients with uncomplicated diverticulitis," which analyzed the health benefits and cost effectiveness of antibiotics for patients with uncomplicated acute diverticulitis—where small pouches form in the digestive track—after another study found that the antibiotics were not effective in patients. After they performed a meta-analysis, they determined that the unnecessary use of the antibiotics cost the health care system \$642 million and had their findings published in <u>Surgery</u>.
