Hospitalist Alice Cha, M.D. '13, Balances Patient Care with Her Passion for Educating Aspiring Young Medical Professionals

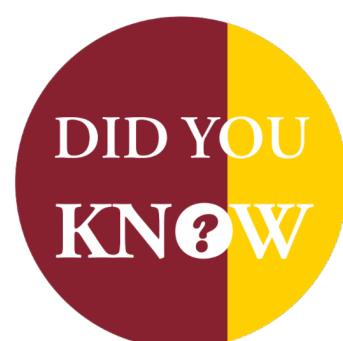
