Esther L. Sabban, Ph.D., is Named the Sidney E. Frank **Distinguished Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral** Sciences

Esther L. Sabban, Ph.D., professor of biochemistry and molecular biology and of psychiatry and behavioral sciences, has been appointed the Sidney E. Frank Distinguished Professor of Psychiatry and



Behavioral Sciences. The Sidney E. Frank Distinguished Professorship was established in 2005 with a \$5 million endowment to support a variety of educational programs and research aimed at understanding what triggers certain forms of psychiatric illness, including medical conditions, depression and stress related to trauma, disaster or terrorism. 
Race for Rehab Set for October 2
