'Rudy's Rabbi' Leaving Touro For City Hall

Mayor Rudolph Giuliani's "rabbi," Leonard Guttman, an instructor and academic counselor in LAS, has taken a leave of absence from Touro to work at City Hall.

His specific duties have yet to be determined, Inside Touro has learned.

Rabbi Guttman, who has taught in the political science department here for nine years, befriended the new mayor at a 1989 Salute to Israel parade. Since then Mayor Giuliani and his wife, Donna Hanover, have joined him in many Jewish events and meetings, and even attended Slichot services and a Purim chagigah, at Rabbi
