

MICHAEL POPKIN, Instructor of Languages and Literature, is the co-editor of Modern French Literature, a two-volume anthology of literary criticism recently published by the Frederick Ungar of literary criticism recently published by the Frederick Ungar Publishing Company. The anthology, which is primarily intended to serve as a library reference work, includes critical excerpts dealing with over 160 French writers of the twentieth century, not only from France but also from Belgium, Switzerland, Canada, the Caribbean, and Africa. Almost 100 of the writers discussed are also represented as critics, and nearly half of all the material included was translated into English for the very first time by the editors. The Usages of Hebraisms, an in-depth study of the absorp-tion of Hebraic elements into the English language, has just been published by FRED HEUMAN, Adjunct Assistant Professor of Languages and Literatures. The book also traces the history of Bible trans-lations into the vernacular and shows the Hebraisms used in the English translations of the Book of Psalms.

SPECIAL SERVICES AWARD
