## GUILD SENDS TEAM TO U.N. CONFERENCE IN CLEVELAND

The Touro chapter of the National Lawyers Guild sent a team of delegates representing Zimbabwe to The Cleveland Model United Nations Conference in Cleveland, Ohio. The team consisted of Guild co-chairman Ed Gaffney and two members, John Gaffney and Mike Rebibo. During the five days of the Conference, the team helped to write and co-sponsor resolutions on apartheid, terrorism and U.S. involvement in Nicaragua. Delegate John Gaffney later received an award for Outstanding Delegate in the Human Rights Sub-Committee. The team received an invitation to attend conferences in New York and other cities in the future, and was encouraged to return to Cleveland next year.
