"Special Section" is about the changes that occur in the legal system of France's Vichy government during World War II. More specifically, it is about the reactions of judges, prosecutors and public defenders when they are instructed by the government to enforce laws that violate fundamental principles of civilized jurisprudence. This description does not, alas, convey the extremely moving and disturbing nature of the film. It raises serious questions about the nature of all legal systems and the people who participate in them or are governed by them.
