TO ALL STUDENTS AND STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

You are invited to apply to the Touro College, Jacob D. Fuchsberg Law Center Friends' Association for grants to support student activities.

The Association was established last fall. It promotes communication between the Law Center and parents, spouses and friends, all of whom are eligible for membership in the Association. There is an annual membership fee to join the organization but funds collected are returned to the school for the support of student activities.

Student organizations, individual students or informal groups of students are eligible to receive grants from these funds. Grants generally will be awarded for activities or projects that are not currently funded and will be of benefit to the entire student body. Those interested in applying for funds should secure an application from the Receptionist, complete it and return it to Associate Dean Saewitz by Friday, Oct. 23, 1987.

On the application form you will be requested to explain the specific activity you would like funded as well as the source of other funds you have access to during the academic year. The application will be reviewed and the grants made by the Board of Directors of the Association. The recipients of the awards will be announced at Family Day, which will take place in November.
