## FIRE DRILL DIRECTIONS

## MOOT COURT BOARD UPDATE

On Monday, November 30th at 5:00 pm and 8:00 pm, the Touro Moot Court Board will participate in the Thirty-Eighth Annual National Moot Court Competition sponsored by the Young Lawyers' Committee of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York and the American College of Trial Lawyers. The two issues that will be addressed are whether a cigarette smoker's tort claims against a cigarette manufacturer are preempted by Congressional legislation and whether a protective order was properly granted to a cigarette manufacturer limiting the use of materials obtained during discovery. Representing Touro Law Center are Linda Morrison and Hal LeMar. They will argue that night against Rutgers and Seton Hall Law Schools. The arguments will be held at 42 West 44th Street in New York.
