EXAMINATION POLICY

1. All rules regarding the administration of final exams will be strictly enforced. Please read pages 14 -16 of the Student Handbook with care.
2. Students are expected to adhere to the instructions given to them by their proctors. Please note that only one student will be permitted to leave the room at a time. Smoking rooms will not be available. Student identification numbers must be placed on the examination bluebook. During closed book examinations, students must place all personal belongings and materials on the side of the room. During semi-restricted exams, only those materials specifically allowed by the professor may be on the student's desk.

TUITION CHARGES - SPRING 1989

As of Fall, 1988, Full-Time students may take as many as sixteen (16) credits in a Fall or Spring semester. If the additional credit is for LAW REVIEW or MOOT COURT BOARD, there is no additional tuition charge. In all other instances, the student taking more than fifteen (15) credits is to be charged the per-credit charge for the additional credit. This charge was not enforced in the Fall, 1988 semester because we felt that sufficient notice had not been given to the students. This charge is to be enforced, however, as of the Spring 1989 semester.

CLINICAL PROGRAM NEWS

Applications for participation in the Soviet Jewry Law Project are now available in Dean Groff's office. Students will earn 2 credits for representation of Soviet Jewish refuseniks. Interested students should complete their applications as soon as possible.

1988-1989 STUDENT HANDBOOK/CODE OF CONDUCT

The Student Handbook/Code of Conduct has been heavily revised for the 1988-89 Academic year. Day students may obtain their copy in Dean Cohen's office. Evening students may obtain their copy from the Receptionist. All students are required to pick up and sign for their copy. You are expected to read both documents with care. Special attention should be given to the Academic Standards section of the Student Handbook beginning on Page 11. Students should also note with particularity the Code of Conduct Article III (Prohibited Conduct): Section A (Academic Misconduct) and Section B (Non-Academic Misconduct). The definition of plagiarism is located in Article III, Section A (1) on page 2 of the Code of Conduct. If you have any questions, please contact Dean Cohen.

Please note that the Referral Section of the Student Handbook (pages 31-35) will clarify for students which administrators handle various issues on a day-to-day basis.
