The Institute of Jewish Law is pleased to announce that Professor J. David Bleich will be its next guest lecturer. Professor Bleich is a world reknowned scholar in Jewish Law and Jewish Studies. He is currently a Professor of Law at Cardozo Law School. Professor Bleich's lecture is entitled, "Fetal Tissue Experimentation: Jewish Tradition and Public Policy". He has recently testified before a Congressional Committee on this topic in relation to a new law which Congress plans to pass regarding this issue. The lecture will take place on Tuesday, January 24, 1989 at 6:00 pm in the Moot Court Room. A reception will follow the lecture.
