DID YOU KNOW ...

...that Touro College will soon announce its connection to Internet? We expect this connection to take place around February 1992. Internet connects the computer networks of large businesses, colleges and government agencies all over the globe. Internet's benefits include providing up-to-the-minute news updates and electronic mail. It also offers the ability to use research facilities; it assists in locating any article printed in any newspaper/magazine within the past ten years, and it will fax the article to the user at his/her request.

How did the forthcoming connection with Internet develop? Touro, in conjunction with Global Enterprise Services(GES), submitted a proposal to the National Science Foundation to fund a connection to the NSFNet, a high speed network which comprises a large portion of Internet. This proposal was written by Mr. David Whitehead, a Senior Technical Analyst with the Academic Computing department of Touro and was submitted in April, 1992. The National Science Foundation approved the grant in October 1992, paving the way for twenty two more institutions of higher education to have access to the Internet.
