MEMO FROM THE PA PROGRAM...

On February 1st, Touro College's School of Health Sciences, which is headquartered in Dix Hills, Long Island, will open an extension site at Coney Island Hospital in South Brooklyn. The objective of this program will be to train individuals to be Physician Assistants.

The announcement was made by Dean Weisberg of the School, and Ed Gerken, Executive Vice President of the Coney Island Medical Group, which will participate in the training program.

"There is a desperate need in the health care field for Physician Assistants," they said.
"Our two institutions are therefore happy to join in developing a unique and creative program to expand Physician Assistant educational opportunities in Brooklyn for persons interested in entering this field where job prospects are excellent."

"The curriculum," Dean Weisberg added, "will be Touro's time-tested and time-proven educational program which was pioneered by our school 20 years ago and which we have developed so successfully since then. PAs provide cost-effective primary health care and many work in medically under-served areas."

Pointing to the current nation-wide shortage of Physician Assistants, Mr. Gerken said: "We at Coney Island Hospital are committed to the recruitment, training and retention of PAs in our area of Brooklyn. Our joint educational effort with Touro College will increase the supply of qualified, competent, caring PAs to serve the health care needs of our community."
