... that an article was printed in The New York Daily News on January 26, 1993 about a recent graduate of the Touro College Physical Therapy Program? The article was about Ms. Nancy Clarke of Elmont, L.I. Ms. Clarke surprised doctors by winning four silver medals in swimming events in 1988 after being told that she would never walk again because of a paralyzed leg. In 1989, Nancy was named "Athlete of the Year" by the U.S. Office of Disabled Athletes. Ms. Clarke is employed as a physical therapist in Booth Memorial Hospital in Flushing and works with about 10 to 13 patients daily in the hospital's gymnasium.

Touro is proud to be able to claim individuals such as Nancy Clarke as graduates of the college.
