## ALUMNI BRUNCH A DAY IN THE SUN

The annual Alumni Brunch held on Sunday, September 13, 1992 was truly a day in the sun for all 125 alumni, guests and faculty in attendance. Not only was it a beautiful day to bask in the newly completed Law Center Courtyard with enough food to satisfy every possible size and variety of appetite (and no competition from the bees that flew in last year) but the audience was treated to the gracious and moving comments of the Guest Speaker, noted trial and appellate attorney William Kunstler, who emphasized the distinction between the initial 25 routine years of his practice and the infinitely more fulfilling nature of the more recent 25 years representing such clients as Jack Ruby, Stokely Carmichael, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Adam Clayton Powell and others.

A 1937 graduate of New York City's DeWitt Clinton HS (and thus a fellow alumnus of Dean Glickstein), Kunstler secured a Phi Beta Kappa enriched BA from Yale in 1941 and served in the United States Army from 1941-46, rising to Major and served in the Army Judge Advocate General's Reserve from 1946-60.

His LLB was granted by Columbia University where he was a Harlan Fisk Stone Scholar in 1948 and a Lecturer in English from 1946-50 and subsequently, spanning 40 years, held professional rank at New York Law, Pace, New School for Social Research and Cooper Union. The author, between 1941 and '91 of more than a dozen published volumes (most legal but some of poetry and commentary), he was a partner with his late brother Michael and others in private practice and in 1966 was a cofounder of the Center for Constitutional Rights where he continues to serve as Vice President and Volunteer Staff Attorney. A frequent contributor to a wide spectrum of periodicals, TV and radio, guest spot gadfly and member of Screen Actors Guild, he has served as a consultant and acted in several screen productions including Oliver Stone's "The Doors" (1990) and Stone's forthcoming "In The Spirit of Crazy Horse" and in Spike Lee's newly released "Malcolm X". Lee almost fired Kunstler from both his consultative and acting roles for causing a large budget overrun by (characteristically) forgetting that in his role as the sentencing judge, he was supposed to hand down a stiff jail sentence. Instead, he dismissed the indictment. In a retake, he behaved.

The day began with a pleasant surprise for the speaker when he accompanied Dean Glickstein from the parking lot to the Office of Development and Public Affairs to meet the Alumni Executive Committee, including **Esq. Wires** Editor Richard Mannheimer ('89) who had literally 'grown up' with the 3 Kunstler siblings due to the close family friendship of their respective parents. After the traditional formal introduction by Dean Glickstein, the Dean called on our Editor to finish the job.

Mannheimer outlined the very different paths that their careers had taken and unexpectedly crossed in their different professions, at such places as Yale, the Southwest Pacific in World

War II, and as recently as June when the Clerk of US Court of Military Appeals asked Mannheimer, who had just become the newest member of that court's bar, to review a randomly selected case record then in preparation "...just to see how our cases are recorded..." and the respondent had been represented by Kunstler!

The festivities concluded with the presentation of a Distinguished Service Award for service to the Alumni Association and to the Law Center, to Jeffrey Wurst ('87), an Alumni Association Past President (1988-90) whose tenure featured several successful innovations including the establishment of **Esq. Wires**, this Newsletter.

## A Message From The Dean

Howard A. Glickstein, Dean

Last Spring I sent a letter to many of you asking for your participation in the Law Center's Annual Fund. The response, if not overwhelming, was gratifying and we finished the 1991-92 fiscal year with record figures for total money collected and percentage of participation. To all of you who contributed throughout the year (listed elsewhere in this Newsletter), a heartfelt thank you for your generous support!

Most Alumni Fund contributions from last year were used to pay for the school's new central courtyard where the Alumni Brunch was again held this year. The courtyard also has been used this Fall as the site for our New Student Reception, a student barbecue, and has become a popular spot for students to get some sun between classes. We have made several other improvements to the Center recently: the main parking lot was paved this past Summer - a long awaited event; word processing equipment has been installed in the second floor lounge for student use; the student pub has been renovated, as has the Faculty Conference Room and the main entrance to the school.

In addition to improving our physical plant, we also have improved our teaching capabilities by adding four outstanding new members to the faculty. Some of you may remember Jack Battaglia, who taught at the Law Center from 1982 to 1984. After a stint in private practice in San Francisco, Jack has returned to teach at Touro. Also joining us are Andy Herz, Lauretta Murdock and Deborah Bartell, whose collective experience in private practice, pro bono work and academia will enable them to make exciting contributions to an already vibrant faculty.

The number of applications for admission to the Law Center was greater last year than ever before, making the job of the Admissions Committee even more difficult. We wound up with our largest entering class (300: 212 full-time and 88 part-time) and the highest percentage of minority students. Over 65% of our students receive financial aid in amounts which are never enough and we are certain to have lost some highly qualified students who were unable to afford a law school education at Touro.

The cover article in the Spring issue of The Touro Lawyer titled "Looking East" discussed several programs in which we were involved in Eastern Europe. These contacts continue to expand. We recently conducted a CLE-type program for over 90 Hungarian judges in Hungary which was so successful that we have been invited back to conduct similar programs for more judges in other parts of Hungary. We also are in the midst of negotiations for a Summer law students' study-abroad program in Moscow. Stay tuned.

I hope that each and every one of you will find the opportunity to visit the Law Center sometime during the year to see the improvements we have made and to speak with faculty members and students. Many of you attended the Alumni Brunch held last month at the school. Alumni also are welcome to act as Judges in our Moot Court competitions, to speak to student groups about their areas of specialization, attend special events held at the school or to just stop in for no reason other than to look around and to say "Hello!"

I also hope that you will find the opportunity to participate in this year's Annual Fund Drive. Tuition alone cannot cover the entire cost of needed physical improvements, faculty salaries or financial aid. With your continued support, the Law Center will continue to make great strides toward providing the highest quality legal education.

## Hon. LEONARD WEXLER NAMED TOURO'S 5TH DISTINGUISHED JURIST-IN-RESIDENCE

U.S. District Court Judge Leonard D. Wexler will be Touro Law Center's Fifth Distinguished Jurist-in-Residence. Dean Howard A. Glickstein announced that Judge Wexler will spend Tuesday and Wednesday, November 3-4, 1992 at the school. The program will culminate with a Public Lecture by Judge Wexler on Wednesday at 6:00 PM in the Law Center Auditorium.

Educated at Indiana University (BS '47) and at New York University (JD '50), he settled in Smithtown shortly after he was admitted to practice. In a distinguished 32 year career as a trial lawyer handling many high-profile civil and criminal cases, he helped shape many of Long Island's legal institutions. He was a Director of the Suffolk County Bar Association from 1956-1960, and founded the Suffolk County Criminal Bar Association in 1965. He helped develop New York State's Assigned Counsel Plan.

Appointed to New York's Eastern District bench by President Ronald Reagan in 1983, Judge Wexler has, in his nine years on that court, written more than 340 published opinions, taught at Hofstra Law School as well as Touro, while lecturing extensively on federal law and procedure to jurists, bar associations and law enforcement agencies.

Most recently Judge Wexler has turned his attention to the international arena and last year travelled to Prague on behalf of the American Bar Association where he lectured to Czechoslovakian judges on the American legal system. While there he helped draft the section of the new Czechoslovakian Constitution dealing with the powers of the judiciary. He recently returned from Budapest, where, as a member of Touro Law Center team, he helped train Hungarian judges and lectured on the importance of an independent judiciary.



## HIGHEST COURT ADMISSIONS PLANNED FOR JUNE 1993

For those who like to plan ahead, The Law Center will sponsor the second Touro Group Admission to the United States Supreme Court on Tuesday, June 1, 1993. The group admission will be moved by Dean Howard Glickstein and will include a tour of the high court's facilities, group admission and tour of United States Court of Military Appeals and other Washington, DC activities.

To be admitted to the bar of the United States Supreme Court, an Attorney must have been admitted and remained in good standing with the bar of the highest court of a state for not less than three years. The Court of Military Appeals requires admission to the bar of any other federal court or to the highest court of a state, territory or US possession.

Further details and registration materials will be distributed in January, 1993.

## N.Y. LAW JOURNAL HAILS PUBLIC INTEREST LAW INTRODUCTION AT TOURO

A recent N.Y. Law Journal article noted that The Class of 1994 will be the first class to complete Touro's public interest requirement for graduation.

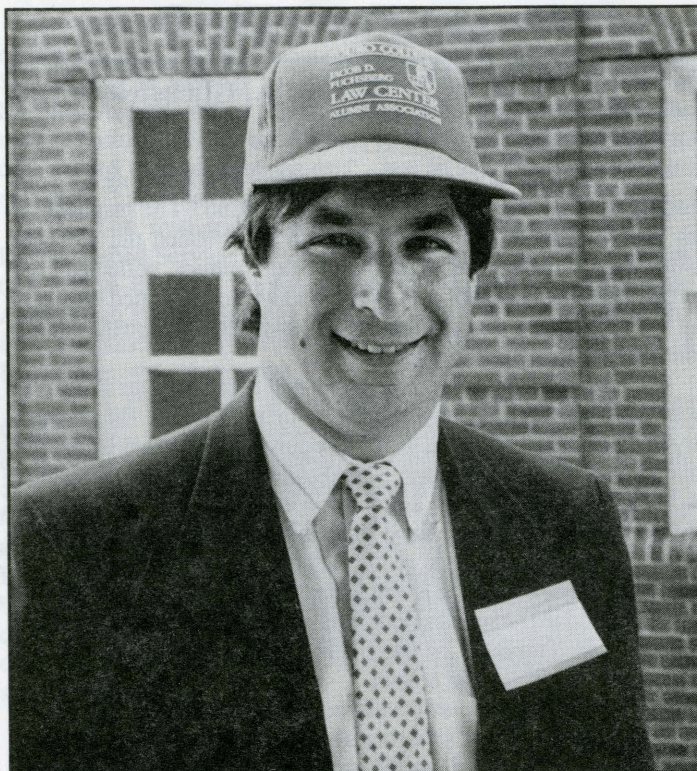
The idea for the Public Interest Law Perspective Requirement was introduced in 1991 by the faculty and supported by Dean Glickstein.

Students are given three options to fulfill the requirement: perform 20 hours of outside pro bono work approved by the school, complete a one-semester clinical course, or take one of two courses, "Rights of the Poor" or "Racism and American Law," a course taught by Dean Glickstein.

Touro offers clinical courses in such issues as mental health, social security disability, criminal law and international human rights asylum.

## **RECORD YEAR FOR ALUMNI CONTRIBUTIONS**

Almost \$60,000 in alumni dues and donations were collected during the 1991-92 Annual Fund, far surpassing previous yearly totals. The amount includes a gift of \$25,000, the largest alumni contribution ever received by the Law Center, donated by Sherry Sarbofsky, '84.
