SOVIET JEWRY LEGAL PROJECT

Touro Law Center is offering a unique opportunity to participate in the Soviet Jewry movement while earning credits. The Soviet Jewry Legal Project, funded through a grant facilitated by Senator Jim Lack and County Executive Elect Patrick Halpin, will involve Touro Law Center students in the following three projects:

1. To petition the United Nations on the rights of Soviet Jews to appeal denial of exit visas.
2. To host a major conference dealing with the legal rights of Soviet Jews including a mock tribunal with student participants.
3. To conduct academic legal research on issues of importance to the Soviet Jewry movement.

Students who are interested, may enroll by one of two means:

1. By doing independent research which will be supervised by Professor Richard Klein.
2. By electing the Soviet Jewry Legal Project externship connected with Professor Daniel Derby's International Law course.

Registration for this project has been extended until Monday, Dec. 7, 1987. For further information, please contact Professor Klein or Professor Derby.
